

## AB 1276 "911" Call and Dispatch Data

The **"911" Call and Dispatch Data** bill creates publicly accessible 911 call and dispatch data, which can be studied to improve emergency response services



- Studies<sup>1</sup> suggest that calls to 911 are highly varied – many may require a response outside of the scope of traditional first response
- There are no common standards for 911 call data collection and reporting. This makes it harder to understand the type of help callers are requesting and if they receive an appropriate response
- State and local governments have a hard time allocating resources to keep pace with the changing needs of community members calling 911

Police officers are sent to too many calls that are better suited for unarmed service providers.

## **Assembly Bill 1276:**

- Requires state and local agencies to compile and share 911 call data with UC Davis Health
- Creates uniform standards for 911 call data collection
- Ensures ethical data collection to respect the privacy of callers
- Establishes a statewide 911 call **data portal** for research purposes
